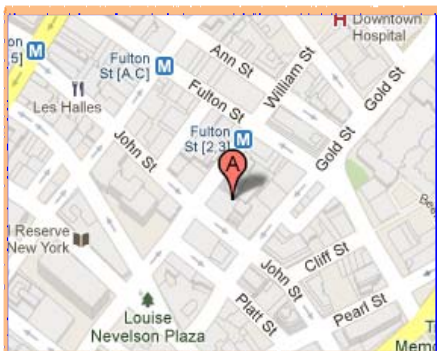

The Health & Safety is the required training by New York State to become a licensed Family Day Care (FDC) or Group Family Day Care (GFDC) provider or assistant.

This course covers the following topics:

- An Introduction to Health and Safety: Competencies for Becoming a Family or Group Family Day Care Provider
- Creating a Healthy Environment
- Protect and Prevent: Child Abuse and Maltreatment, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) and Shaken Baby Syndrome
- Emergency Preparation and First Aid Response

## Health and Safety Rebate

Upon successful completion of the Health & Safety Training, eligible providers are issued a Health and Safety Training Rebate application to access up to \$235 of training cost. ## Healthcare Consultancies

CHCF's has a bilingual and **FREE** nurse and Healthcare Consultant, José Ortiz, RN that provides:

- Assistance and Consultations around Health Care Plans.
- Medication Administration Training (MAT), as Independent Study or group course, to obtain approval to administer medication such as Ephinephrine, Auto injectors, Asthma Inhalers, Nebulizers, and Benadryl (Diphenhydramine).
- Authorized American Heart Association-certified training in Infant, Child & Adult Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and First Aid (in Spanish only).
- Site visits and individualized consultations around healthy and safety issues.
- Referrals and information about new policy requiring CPR/First Aid certification.

## 30 Hour Training Requirements - In Spanish only

The 30 Hour Training is a mandatory requirement in order to renew the FDC/GFDC registration/license for each given licensing period.

The 30 hours of training cover the following topics:

- Principles of Early Childhood Development, including the appropriate supervision of children; meeting the needs of children enrolled in the program with physical or emotional challenges; and behavior management and discipline.
- Safety and security procedures including communication between parents and staff
- Nutrition and Health needs of Children
- Child Care Program Development
- Business Record Maintenance and Management
- Child abuse identification and Prevention
- Statutes and Regulations pertaining to Child Care
- Statutes and Regulations pertaining to Abuse and Maltreatment
- Identification, Diagnosis and Prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome

## Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential

CHCF provides high-quality, bilingual CDA courses recognized by the Council for Professional Recognition including a FREE CDA Advisor service. Our 120-hour training is designed for people who are currently working with children and would like to learn the basic principles of Early Childhood Education, and obtain a Child Development Associate Credential. If you want to participate in this class call us now and register for an orientation and to obtain financial assistance.

## Start-Up Application Aid

CHCF offers **FREE** individualized assistance to help potential providers fill out their license application forms. Call us to make an appointment.

## “Quality Steps” Mentoring Program

CHCF offers **FREE** opportunities to enhance the quality of Early Education programs and provide the skills to build great futures for children. Through its mentoring program, “Quality Steps,” our specialized staff provides free individualized technical assistance on: child development, health, nutrition, learning environments, and artistic exploration; sources for affordable, durable toys and equipment; dealing with behavior management and discipline issues; communication with parents; addressing regulatory requirements and safety practices; marketing and enrolling children; dealing with public contracts, subsidies, and vouchers; etc.

## Educational Incentive Program (EIP)

New York State provides up to \$2,000 in grants that help child care providers to pay for classes that support their professional development. For more information and to apply for this grant, call us and make an appointment.

### Grants

Funding is available to new, existing and legally-exempt child care providers via the New York State Office of Children and Family Services. These grants are awarded to promote safe and healthy environments and enhance programs to promote high quality learning experiences. Providers can receive \$500, \$200, or \$75 to cover the cost of educational materials, toys, books and other eligible expenses. Grants are limited and are based on income eligibility.

#### Start-Up Grants

For new child care providers that have received their license or registration within the last six months, CHCF offers \$500 grants to start-up their business that will promote high quality learning experiences for children.

#### Health & Safety Grants

Every two years, for currently licensed and registered child care providers, CHCF offers \$200 grants to further promote healthy and safe environments, as well as high quality early care and education experiences for children. Furthermore, once a grant is awarded, CHCF will provide guidance and assessments on room arrangement, health & safety, and professional development.

# Registration Information & Policies

## To Register

All participants are required to register in advance, at least five work days weeks before the start date of the desired training. You can register through the following methods:

- PHONE by calling 212-206-1090.
- FAX by dialing 212-206-8093. Please send with "Training Registration-Helen Marte" in the attention line.
- IN PERSON by coming to our office between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

A confirmation letter will be sent to you upon receipt of your registration information and payment. If the class is full, you will be notified immediately for placement in the next available class.

## Payment Methods

We accept credit cards, money orders, EIP and MAT award letters, and business checks. Please make out money orders and business checks to CHCF. Personal checks and cash are not accepted.

## Cancellation & Credit

Cancellations must be made at least three days prior to the training session. A credit will be issued for advanced cancellations or if cancellation was made by CHCF. The credit can be applied to another CHCF training or workshop and must be used within three months of issue. No cash refunds will be given.

## Certificates

Training certificates are issued to participants after successful completion of the training including all competency testing and receipt of full payment. SUNY Health & Safety training attendees will receive their certificates after attending and passing the corresponding competency tests with a score of 80% or higher.

## Lateness

CHCF encourages participants to arrive 15 minutes prior to the training start time. If a participant is late, individual trainers reserve their right to admit participants into the classroom at their own discretion. For the SUNY Health & Safety training course, participants will not be admitted once the class has started.

## Children

Children are not allowed in the training room at any time.
